Distribution of 2008 Donor Gifts

Nazarene Financial Services has released the 2008 report that outlines the distribution of \$77.9 million in donor gifts from churches and individuals. This global mission investment in World Evangelism Fund and Mission Specials represents:

- Global Mission – \$60.7 million (78.0 percent)
- Mission Support and Delivery - \$9.2 million (11.8 percent)
- Higher Education - \$3.3 million (4.2 percent)
- General Superintendents – \$1.9 million (2.5 percent)
- Discipleship - \$1.2 million (1.6 percent)
- General Board and General Assembly Arrangements – \$803,000 (1 percent)
- Youth - \$708,258 (0.9 percent)
