

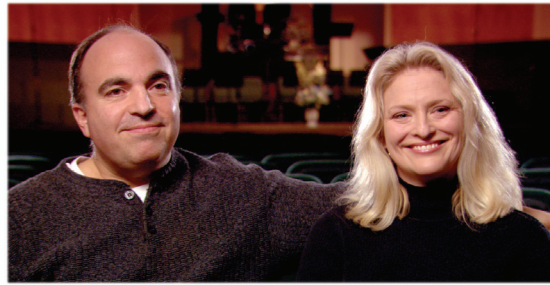


Ownership

Who owns it all—you or God? That’s the issue we’ll explore today as we begin our Lordship Living series by examining the question—“Isn’t it all mine?”

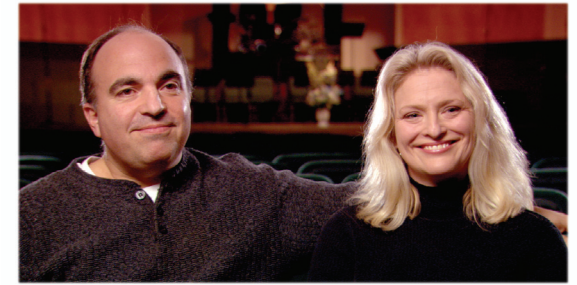


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
