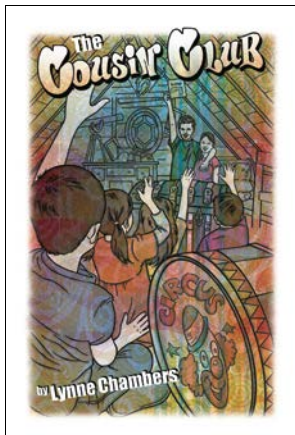

by Beverly Schmelzenbach

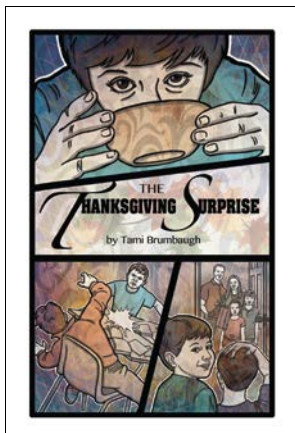

The story is a fictional account of combined true stories from the Adopt-A-School Ministry at Olathe College Church of the Nazarene.

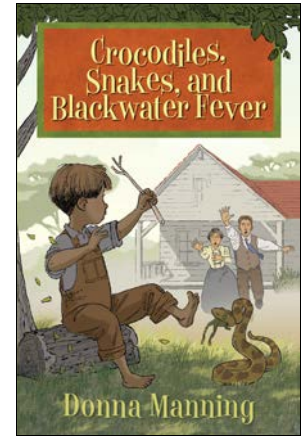

by Donna Manning

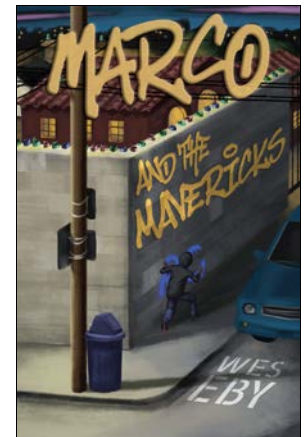
